Lenten Activities 2018

The season of Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday during half term (14th February) with the celebration of Mass and the distribution of ashes in church.

Lent is the season when we follow the example of Jesus who went alone into the wilderness to pray and fast in order to prepare Himself for His coming suffering. Traditionally this has meant that we 'give up something' for the benefit of others but it is also an opportunity for prayer and reflection. It is a season of renewal.

Lent prepares us for Easter, the most important time in the Church year, when we celebrate Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday. Therefore we will prepare for this important time in the following ways.

As a Worshipping Community

Oak - Tuesday 13th March

Elm - Monday 5th March

Beech - Monday 26th February

Eucalyptus - Tuesday 20th February

Sycamore - Monday 19th March

Weekly Mass – This is voluntary for children and parents and will take place every Friday during Lent (beginning 23rd February) at 8.00 am in church. Everyone is welcome.

Prayer Meetings – These will take place each week at dinnertimes for the staff and children. Please let us know if there are any intentions you would like us to pray for.

Holy Week Passion Play "Hosanna!" (Years 3, 4 & 5). This will take place in church on Tuesday 27th March at 2.00pm and 6.30pm.
