

### Science

Children name human body parts and senses and compare them with those of common animals. Draw pictograms using data about differences between children, for example hair colour and discuss the needs of pets. Collect, draw, label and identify minibeasts.

### Religious Education

Be aware of the beauty of God's world and how we can care for it. Know God made us because he loves us, but Adam and Eve made wrong choices. Hear the story of Noah. Know that God sent Gabriel to ask Mary to be the mother of his Son & the visit to Elizabeth. Know the story of the birth of Jesus.

### Physical Education –

Develop the basic skills of traveling rolling, jumping and tuck shapes Link movements together. Explore, remember, repeat and link a range of actions with co-ordination and control. Compose a short dance independently.

### Creative : History

Children will learn what happened in the Great Fire of London and when it was. Contrast fire-safety from the past with today. Study the rhymes and songs of the time; study St Paul's Cathedral and make sketches, prints, and 3D models inspired by this great building. Enthused by the famous diarists Samuel Pepys and John Evelyn, write diaries and read them to the class!

### Art / Design Technology

Draw from imagination, examine paintings and sculptures and use them to develop their ideas about St Paul's Cathedral. They will use shape and form when making models. Pupils will learn about abstract art by potato printing They will compare their own work to Paul Klee's work.
